# **2017 Capital Budget Speech**

## **Investing in Our Infrastructure**

November 14, 2016

Good evening members of Council and citizens of Whitehorse. I am very pleased to be presenting the proposed Capital Budget for 2017 to 2020. This budget will make an investment in our aging infrastructure that is long overdue for our community.

I would like to thank members of Council for their insight and input into the budget process. As members of council, we listen to our communities' needs and make decisions with the input we receive. Being presented tonight, is a budget that takes steps to support our community and takes a conservative and strategic approach in our investment choices.

The 2017 Capital Budget will invest \$47 million in critical infrastructure projects that will improve City operations and services for our citizens. This includes \$14.2 million of city funds and \$13.6 million from a combination of federal and territorial funding. This is a significant investment in the infrastructure that is needed to deliver key municipal services, including water and waste systems, roads, recreation and transit.

Each year the Capital Budget sets out a four year spending plan for the City's capital development and is approved by Council. This timeframe gives stability and predictability for our citizens and their government.

Like we have done in previous years, City Council is introducing a budget that is fiscally responsible. The City is making the best possible use of infrastructure funding that is available from the Governments of Canada and Yukon. This external funding is absolutely necessary for infrastructure investment and renewal.

In this capital budget, citizens will notice that we have an ongoing top priority which is the City's new Operations Building.

Over the past few years the City has taken a serious look at what the critical needs are of this project in order to move forward with the most cost-effective plan as possible. Several design estimates will be completed this year and early next year as we finish the design process. This is critical in order for us to fully understand the costs of this project.

By relocating and consolidating our operations, this project means that fewer pieces of heavy equipment will be seen in the downtown core and prime real estate will be available for development in our downtown and industrial areas. In addition, this project will invest in energy efficiencies such as solar panels and HVAC systems to help reduce our energy footprint.

The City will invest \$45 million on this project over three years; 5 million of which was allocated in the 2016 Capital budget for design and site preparation. Funding will come from the Federal Gas Tax Fund, City reserves and financing. I'm pleased to say that the City will still have sufficient funds left in reserves for other infrastructure priorities and projects.

This project is one of many steps our growing City is taking to become a more efficient, cost-effective and sustainably run community.

While our Capital Budget spans four years, I would like to share with you some 2017 project highlights.

In addition to the new Operations Building, the City remains committed to improving and maintaining our neighbourhoods. We will invest \$500,000 next year on a detailed design for the reconstruction of Hillcrest. To minimize inconvenience and impact on residents, we are proposing to phase this large project over multiple years with phase one beginning in 2018. Work during these phases will include water, sewer, and road construction to improve aging infrastructure.

The Range Point neighbourhood plan will continue to be implemented in 2017 and will include trail systems, the completion of Point Park planning, and a playground.

In order to strengthen our core, the City will spend \$100,000 (plus an additional \$100,000 carried from 2016) in the creation of a new plan for both Downtown and Marwell. These areas are linked and experience similar development pressures.

The City will also spend \$200,000 in 2017 on design for the reconstruction of Alexander Street from 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Construction will begin in 2018 and will include improvements to water, sewer, roads, sidewalk, lighting, and landscaping.

As part of our Pavement Management Program, each year we identify existing paved roads to determine their condition and identify roads that require maintenance. This approach avoids future capital costs by extending service life and avoiding full reconstruction of the road. Next year we will invest \$1,000,000 for asphalt overlay on 4th Avenue from Robert Service Way to Main Street.

Another area I would like to highlight is transportation. Our Transit department is reviewing bus stop amenities throughout the transit network and the City is adding shelters or benches where they are most needed. In 2017, we will spend almost \$17,000 on design work at the 2nd and Main Street shelter, three new benches, and shelter relocation. \$55,000 will go towards a Transit Master Plan which will focus on mobility, livability, and connectivity. This supports Council's vision of a sustainable, resilient and liveable Whitehorse. It will incorporate the City's goals for economic prosperity, environmental and social well-being, and a vibrant culture.

In addition to Transit, our maintenance efforts in 2017 will include \$80,000 in major sidewalk repairs and para ramp infills, which are vital to the safety of our residents; and \$75,000 in annual aquatic centre maintenance at the Canada Games Centre in order to maintain our service standards.

2017 will also see several planning initiatives such as:

- A review of the City's Heritage Program, which includes grants, leasing, heritage registry, and more. This project would look to harmonize City rules and Yukon Government procedures, resulting in a simpler, more refined approach to heritage management.
- Preparation for the review of the City's Official Community Plan will begin in 2017 with extensive public consultation. A new plan is estimated to be presented for adoption in 2018. It will consolidate information into one key guiding document, providing policy and land use vision for the entire city.
- The Downtown Parking Management Plan, which was created in 2011, will also see an update at its five year mark in 2017. This plan looks at the function of Downtown parking and recommends changes to achieve objectives such as economic vitality, convenience, revenue/operating costs, environmental sustainability, and more. Additional information and updates are now needed in order to ensure the plan remains successful and on track.

The 2017 capital budget also highlights recreation. It is no surprise that recreation, parks, and trails are very important to our citizens. These programs and facilities provide community health and wellness benefits, and they enhance our overall quality of life. Trails also offer active transportation benefits.

In 2017, the City will spend over \$800,000 on parks and trails projects and upgrades. This includes erosion control, irrigation in Whistle Bend, the continued implementation of a trail plan, and the creation of a Parks and Recreation master plan. The citizens of Whitehorse enjoy year-round access to ample green spaces, accessible trails, active living opportunities, and cultural events that reflect our commitment to creating a liveable, safe, attractive, healthy, and sustainable community. Whitehorse's parks and recreation facilities are vital to the personal, community, social and economic well-being of our city. To ensure that our infrastructure and programming is meeting the needs of our citizens, it is important to establish a plan that can help guide us.

Included in the 2017 Capital Budget is Appendix B which is a list of projects that we would like to fund through Gas Tax and other external funding sources. These projects will only move forward once external funding is identified. We are taking this reserved approach to ensure responsible spending.

Some of the projects waiting for external funding include:

- The downtown reconstruction of Wheeler St. West. This project will help implement the City's Sustainability Plan through our goals for a strong downtown and livable neighbourhood.
- Additional transit buses are proposed to be added beginning in 2017 with two buses per year. The two units to be replaced in 2017 will be approximately 13 years old. The buses would be funded using the federal transit funding and transit equipment replacement reserves for 2017. Gas tax applications will be submitted for years beyond 2017 as funding becomes available.
- Permanent line markings for main roads. These markings are built slightly below pavement level so they can be safely plowed, and have a decreased maintenance cost compared to painted markings.
- And revisions to Pioneer Cemetery, which will restore and upgrade it to a place of prominence and a worthy tribute to Yukon pioneers laid to rest. These improvements will make grounds maintenance less expensive and time consuming, making the cemetery a safer and more respected public space.

These are only a small sample of some of the important projects waiting for external funding. We continue to work cooperatively with our funding partners in the Federal and Yukon governments. We value and appreciate the funding we receive from our government partners. Without this funding we wouldn't be able to move forward on important community projects.

This proposed budget makes significant investments in our City's aging infrastructure. This will assist in maintaining a high level of service to citizens, for today and tomorrow.

Once again the City is working hard to have a Capital Budget in place by the end of this year. The public hearing input night will be November 28<sup>th</sup> and second and third reading is scheduled for December 12<sup>th</sup>, 2016.

This will give local businesses and contractors as much advance notice as possible, so they can prioritize and plan for the City's upcoming capital projects. We are doing this to maximize economic opportunities for all of our local businesses.

I would like to recognize the hard work done by administration and again thank council. Many hours of work have gone into this budget for council's consideration.

The 2017 Capital Budget makes a strong contribution to our key priorities and our vision for Whitehorse as a well-planned, self-sustaining community that is an exceptional place we are all proud to call home.
